FY 2026 BUDGET APPROVED

With the approval of the \$125 million Fiscal Year 2026 Budget, we're committed to transparency, and that means showing you exactly how your money is being spent.

A total of \$32.6 million has been allocated for infrastructure improvements, encompassing street reconstruction, drainage upgrades, and water/wastewater system enhancements. The General Fund budget is \$62.9 million, including \$22.5 million for non-recurring capital expenditures aimed at long-term community development.



The infographic above illustrates how every tax dollar is allocated across city departments. At the end of the fiscal year, the City expects to maintain a General Fund reserve of \$22.3 million, representing approximately 55% of our annual operations and maintenance costs, a strong indicator of the City's ongoing financial health. THE LUKE CELEBRATES 125 YEARS



On September 12th, The Luke Church, Humble's oldest congregation, celebrated the 125th anniversary of its founding. To commemorate the occasion, Mayor Norman Funderburk presented Dr. Timothy Sloan with a proclamation as well as a Texas flag that flew over City Hall. Originally organized as the St. Luke Missionary Baptist Church just days after the 1900 Hurricane that devastated Galveston and the region; the congregation first met behind the old Lindsay Lumber Co. for many years before relocating to Bordersville. The Luke was welcomed back home to Humble in 2011 at its current location on South Houston Avenue where it serves a congregation of more than 8,000 members.

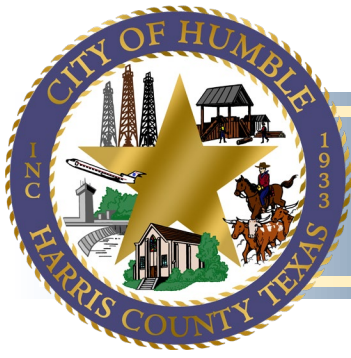

The City of Humble is set to adopt its 2025 Property Tax Rate on September 25th at 6:30 P.M. and as part of this process will hold a Public Hearing at City Hall on that date and time. This year a rate of \$0.258171 per \$100 in assessed valuation has been proposed to fund the operations and maintenance of the City. The current tax rate is \$0.261476.
