



CRIME IS GOING DOWN



The City has committed millions of dollars towards public safety in the last few years and it is paying off. The Police Department recently released their 2024 Crime Statistics which show decreases in sexual assaults (-9.4%) robberies (-38.3%), aggravated assaults (-30.3%), burglaries (-21.3%) and burglary of motor vehicles (-14.3%) from 2023. Overall the city experienced a 23% reduction in violent crimes and a 7% reduction in property crimes. Auto theft did experience a 16.1% increase, however, it is important to note that auto theft has become a major regional issue facing all area departments and we are stepping up our efforts. From the new real time crime center to drones to an increase in the number of officers on the streets, we remain committed to making your city safer every day.
