



DAVID PIERCE RETIRES AFTER 23 YEARS



Mayor Pro Tem David Pierce officially left office at the conclusion of the May 9th City Council meeting after a combined 25 years serving the city as a council member. Mr. Pierce's first tour of duty began in 1986, when he became one of the youngest members of the City Council ever elected – he retired the first time in 2002. He was elected again in 2015 and was named Mayor Pro Tem in 2021. HIRSCH PARK POOL NOW OPEN

Humble seniors will continue to have dedicated access to the pool Tuesdays through Thursdays from 9:00 A.M. – 11:00 A.M. Admission for all ages is \$3.00. Beginning in August the pool will only be open on weekends from 11:00 A.M. – 6:00 P.M. and on Labor Day before closing for the season.
