As most residents in the Lakeland Subdivision know, Sharon Drive has routinely experienced high water during significant rain events due to the topography.

Public Works crews worked diligently ahead of the last rain event and significantly improved the flow of water from this area to the outfall into Jordan's Gully and should help with this chronic problem that has no easy solution.



Elsewhere in the city, crews continue our maintenance program on the storm sewer system televising and cleaning the lines to ensure the system is operating at optimal performance.

## BE STORM READY THIS HURRICANE SEASON



Hurricane season is here and if the predictions are right, it should be a busy one. Residents are encouraged to enroll in the Smart 911 notification system to receive emergency alerts, simply visit [www.swift911.com](http://www.swift911.com) and click "sign up." Prepare your home by having basic supplies ready such as

batteries, flashlights, radios, water for drinking and sanitation, and gasoline for generators. Pack your go-bag in case of an evacuation order including a 7-day supply of medication, non-perishable food, bottled water, pet food, spare home and car keys, cash, copies of important documents and don't forget your toothbrush!

## KEEP GRASS CLIPPINGS IN THE YARD

Friendly reminder that blowing or leaving grass clippings and other yard waste in the street is illegal. Besides being a code violation, leaves and grass clippings can clog the storm water drain system. When drains are clogged, guess what backs up and floods roadways



and property? Residents are encouraged to blow grass clippings back onto their lawn; collect clippings and leaves into a compost pile; or sweep, collect and bag clippings and leaves to be disposed of properly. Motorcyclists will thank you as well.

## POST STORM DEBRIS

Speaking of things not to be left on the curb... we have had our fair share of severe weather this spring; many of you have had to clean up limbs and downed trees – and we do our best to assist in any way we can. However, we do not have the personnel or the equipment to pick up limbs and trees from the curb. Please coordinate with your tree service or garbage service to have them properly removed.
