## HUMBLE PD UNVEILS NEW LIVERY

For the first time in nearly twenty years, the Humble Police Department has a new look. The streamlined design for its patrol and traffic enforcement fleet features the department's badge, modern font, and a single white door panel on the otherwise black Chevrolet Tahoes. The Traffic Enforcement Division will be all black with the same design and lettering – though with "ghost" decals. Police vehicle design is important for identifying our agency against other law enforcement agencies in the area, which were becoming very similar in their color schemes and designs. The new design will be rolled out over the next few years as vehicles are go through the normal replacement cycle.



## FIRE CHIEF ACHIEVES CFO DESIGNATION



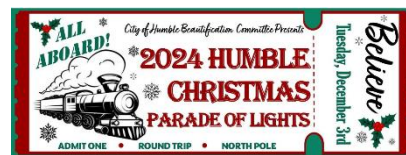

## MAIN AND HOUSTON AVE. RE-OPEN



Mayor Norman Funderburk recently joined members of the Public Works Streets Department to re-open the newly renovated intersection of Main and Houston Avenue. The intersection improvement was part of the FY24 Capital Plan and addressed pedestrian safety, ADA compliance, upgraded traffic signals, and improved aesthetics through the use of decorative pavers and turn of the century light fixtures and posts. Additionally, the intersection now has appropriate ADA compliant pedestrian ramps, and will use an updated video imaging vehicle detection system for more efficient traffic cycling. The \$700,000 project was funded through the Red Light Camera Fund, which allows for spending proceeds from red light camera violations on pedestrian safety and intersection improvement.
