Zientek holds multiple Certifications through TEEEX and TCOLE, is a graduate of the FBI National Academy, FBI LEEDA program, and the Law Enforcement Management Institute of Texas. During his time in Humble, Chief Zientek has spearheaded the Department's efforts to improve the use of a multitude of technologies that assist officers in solving, preventing and reducing the fear of crime for our residents.

HIRSCH PARK POOL NOW OPEN

The City's public pool located at Hirsch Park is now open for the 2025 season! Beginning in August the pool will only be open on weekends from 11:00 A.M. – 6:00 P.M. and on Labor Day before closing for the season.
