



CHANGES TO UTILITY PAYMENTS

As we prepare to launch the City's new online utility payment portal, there will be a brief pause in payment processing at the end of August. During this time, no utility payments can be accepted. The new system is expected to go live on Wednesday, September 3. Once launched, credit card payments by phone will no longer be accepted, and a transaction fee of 3.75% (minimum \$2.50) will apply to all credit card payments made through the new portal as required by the credit card companies. We appreciate your patience and understanding during this transition to a more efficient and user-friendly platform. Please continue to monitor the City's website for updates as the launch date approaches.

The payment schedule will be as follows:

- Friday, August 22 – Last day to make cash or check payments in person
- Saturday, August 23 – Last day to make credit card payments
- August 24 – September 2 – No payments accepted
- Wednesday, September 3 – New online payment portal launches
