The City will soon be transitioning to a new online payment portal for utility bills to provide a more efficient and user-friendly experience. As part of this change, over-the-phone payments will no longer be accepted. While an exact start date has not yet been determined, the new system is expected to launch in September. CITY TO PREPARE BUDGET FOR FY 25-26

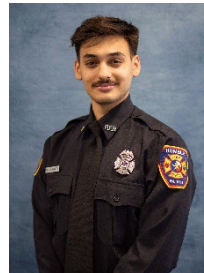
